

# Remember to RENDER! Taxable Property Renditions are due April 1st.

## Does this apply to you?

If you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income, such as equipment or inventory owned by a business, it does.

## What is a rendition?

A rendition is a report to your county appraisal district that lists all of the taxable property that you owned or controlled on January 1 of this year. This often applies to furniture, fixtures, equipment or inventory owned by a business.

## What are the advantages of filing?

- You give your opinion of your property's value.
- You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the right address
- If your property's value depreciated, you can file a report of decreased value

## What is the deadline?

- LAST DAY FOR FILING RENDITIONS IS APRIL 1st.
- An automatic extension to May 1 is available if requested in writing by the April 1 deadline
- The chief appraiser may grant an additional 15 days to an owner who shows good cause in writing.

## REMEMBER!!

Filing is your responsibility. If you render late, don't render or file an incomplete or false rendition, you may face a 10 to 50 percent penalty.
